Clifford A. Rieders Appointed to Pennsylvania Civil Procedural Rules Committee



An Order was issued by the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania concerning appointments to its Civil Procedural Rules Committee. Order #695 Civil Procedural Rules Docket Per Curiam Order on May 1, 2019, appointed Clifford A. Rieders, Esquire, Lycoming County, as a member of the Civil Procedural Rules Committee for a term of five years, commencing July 1, 2019.

Rieders is a partner in the Williamsport Law Firm of Rieders, Travis, Humphrey, Waters & Dohrmann. The attorney is a Phi Beta Kappa, cum laude graduate of New York University and received his juris doctoral degree from Georgetown University. Rieders clerked for Federal Judge Malcolm Muir prior to his work with the Law Firm. Attorney Rieders is a past president of the Pennsylvania Trial Lawyers Association, now the Pennsylvania Association of Justice, past president of the Federal Bar Association, Central Pennsylvania region. He is a nationally Board certified trial advocate in civil law and procedure and is a life member of the American Law Institute where Rieders has served on a number of Consultative Groups. Cliff Rieders is admitted in Pennsylvania, New York, District of Columbia, the Second and Third Circuits, the United States Supreme Court and a number of federal district courts around the country.

Rieders currently serves on the Supreme Court's Standard Civil Jury Instruction Committee where he has been active in assisting to update standard jury instructions to help achieve a plain English approach.

Rieders has an eclectic legal practice ranging from medical malpractice, multi-district litigation, appellate work, commercial litigation, and he is chief counsel for a community bank as well. Rieders has always had a considerable civil rights practice and is still active in that field.
